Update and prayer request: Vote on Women Bishops

In its July meeting the General Synod of the Church of England agreed to postpone their vote on Women Bishops until their autumn meeting. This meeting will be held in London from 19th to 21st November. You are asked to continue to pray for all General Synod members (Bishops, Clergy and Laity) over the coming months. It is a positive step that the vote was not taken in July (for the vast majority of church people who are in favour of female bishops on equal terms to male bishops), because it means the wording of the amendment which was causing hurt and upset was deemed to be unfair. However the standing committee thinks that just removing the specific controversial amendment would overall not meet with sufficient approval, and risk not achieving the necessary numbers in the voting: in order for the vote for women bishops to be carried in November, two thirds of the Bishops, the Clergy and the lay members present must vote in favour. Five suggestions for re-wording the specific amendment have been sent to Synod members for consultation, and the options will be debated by the House of Bishops on 12th and 13th September. If the vote is passed in November, and there are no further setbacks on the legislative path, the name of the first woman bishop could be announced at the end of 2014
