1 Corinthians 1.26-29

²⁶Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise

chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; ²⁸God chose what is
low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing

Gospel

Matthew 2.13-18

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

¹³After the wise men had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a
dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and
remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to
destroy him.' ¹⁴Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night,
and went to Egypt, ¹⁵and remained there until the death of Herod. This was
**to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, 'Out of
Egypt I have called my son.'** ¹⁶When Herod saw that he had been tricked by
the wise men, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and
around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time
that he had learned from the wise men. ¹⁷Then was fulfilled what had been
spoken through the prophet Jeremiah:

¹⁸'A voice was heard in Ramah,
wailing and loud lamentation,
Rachel weeping for her children;

she refused to be consoled, because they are no more.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
