that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid,
that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

³A voice cries out:

'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD,

make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

⁴Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low;
the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

⁵Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together,
for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.'

¹¹He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms,
and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

New Testament Reading

Galatians 3.23-29

²³Before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith
would be revealed. ²⁴Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so
that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵But now that faith has come, we are no longer
subject to a disciplinarian, ²⁶for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through
faith. ²⁷As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with
Christ; ²⁸There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is
no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹And if you belong
to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise.

Gospel

Luke 1.57-66,80

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

⁵⁷The time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. ⁵⁸Her neighbours
and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy to her, and they
rejoiced with her. ⁵⁹On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they
were going to name him Zechariah after his father. ⁶⁰**But his mother said, 'No; he is
to be called John.'** ⁶¹**They said to her, 'None of your relatives has this name.'** ⁶²Then
they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him.

⁶³He asked for a writing-tablet and wrote, **'His name is John.'** **And all of them were
amazed.** ⁶⁴Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to
speak, praising God. ⁶⁵Fear came over all their neighbours, and all these things were
talked about throughout the entire hill country of Judea. ⁶⁶**All who heard them
pondered them and said, 'What then will this child become?' For, indeed, the hand
of the Lord was with him.**

⁸⁰The child grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the wilderness until the
day he appeared publicly to Israel.
