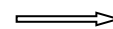

New Testament Reading

Brothers and sisters: ¹¹May you be made strong with all the strength that comes

Psalm 46

from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with
patience, ¹²while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share
in the inheritance of the saints in the light. ¹³He has rescued us from the power of
darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we
have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

¹⁵He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; ¹⁶for in him all
things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether
thrones or dominions or rulers or powers – all things have been created through
him and for him. ¹⁷He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together.
¹⁸He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the
dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹For in him all the
fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰and through him God was pleased to

Gospel

Luke 23.33-43

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

³³When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there
with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴**Then Jesus said, 'Father,
forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to
divide his clothing. ³⁵And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at
him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his
chosen one!' ³⁶The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour
wine, ³⁷and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' ³⁸There was also
an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.' ³⁹One of the criminals who
were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, 'Are you not the Messiah? Save
yourself and us!' ⁴⁰But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since
you are under the same sentence of condemnation? ⁴¹And we indeed have been
condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man
has done nothing wrong.' ⁴²Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into
your kingdom.' ⁴³Jesus replied, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in
Paradise.'**
