But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. ¹⁴When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. ¹⁵When **it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, 'This is a deserted place,** and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the **villages and buy food for themselves.'** ¹⁶Jesus said to them, **'They need not go away; you give them something to eat.'** ¹⁷They replied, **'We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish.'** ¹⁸And he said, **'Bring them here to me.'** ¹⁹Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass.
