Hebrews 5.5-10

⁵Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the
one who said to him,

‘You are my Son,
today I have begotten you’;

⁶as he says also in another place,

‘You are a priest for ever,

Gospel

John 12.20-33

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

²⁰Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. ²¹They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, ‘Sir, we wish to see Jesus.’ ²²Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³Jesus answered them, ‘The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

²⁷‘Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say – “Father, save me from this hour”? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. ²⁸Father, glorify your name.’ Then a voice came from heaven, ‘I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.’

²⁹The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, ‘An angel has spoken to him.’ ³⁰Jesus answered, ‘This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. ³¹Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. ³²And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.’ ³³He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

Passiontide: Today marks the beginning of Passiontide so a few dates for your diary. Next Sunday, **Palm Sunday, the service begins outside at 9.45** with the blessing of palms and the procession into the Church. In the Evening we have **prayer at the cross at 5.30.** During Holy Week there will be **Evening prayer on Monday Tuesday and Wednesday at 8.00pm.** Each evening we will be reflecting on one of the 3 readings used during the Easter Vigil. On **Maundy Thursday there is the Eucharist of the Last Supper at 8.00pm** and on **Good Friday there is a morning informal worship at 10.00am and in the afternoon at 2.00pm we have our service of devotion to the Crucified.** On Saturday evening, **the Easter vigil begins—outside at 8.00pm.** It is the most important and ancient of all Christian worship and it would be wonderful to see as many of you as possible at this beautiful service where the Resurrection is first proclaimed.
